Dear Nellie and All,

Thanks a lot for the paper with the Co. pictures, they do look natural and I have just finished a letter to Mrs Daniels at Simeon. If Gordon went to the post office any time, when he was there, he probably met her, as she was post mistress for several years, is retired now, for 15 years service and her daughter-in-law appointed in her place.

Perhaps you do not hear from home often, but Elmer sent me a paper telling of Tillie passing away, the 16th of Nov. at 10 P.M. I have not had a letter from any one yet, but Tillie has had three real bad spells since last Christmas but when Elmer wrote Nov 3^d, Tillie was able to go to the table for at least one meal a day. She was 78, the 3^d of Nov. and they ^{would} have been married 57 years the 5th of Dec. We have been expecting this, but just the same when any one is sick I get home sick, and now I am more than I have been before.

I have often wondered if you received my letter of June 9th with

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the Cherry records I have. I did not have the year of Grandma's death, but it was about Nov. 1884, I found in an old letter ^{Bellevue, Neb} a few days ago. I hope you could make out the connections, and that there was no extra postage.

We have not had any bad storms yet, but look for a hard winter and plenty of rain, if no snow. There is quite a lot of sickness around here now, Flu. I guess, Geo has been in bed several days this week, but is up now, and the way I feel to-night, I guess my turn is on the way, but I did want to get the washing out of the way to-morrow, before it does rain.

Must close now, hope all are well, and write and tell me the news when you have time,
