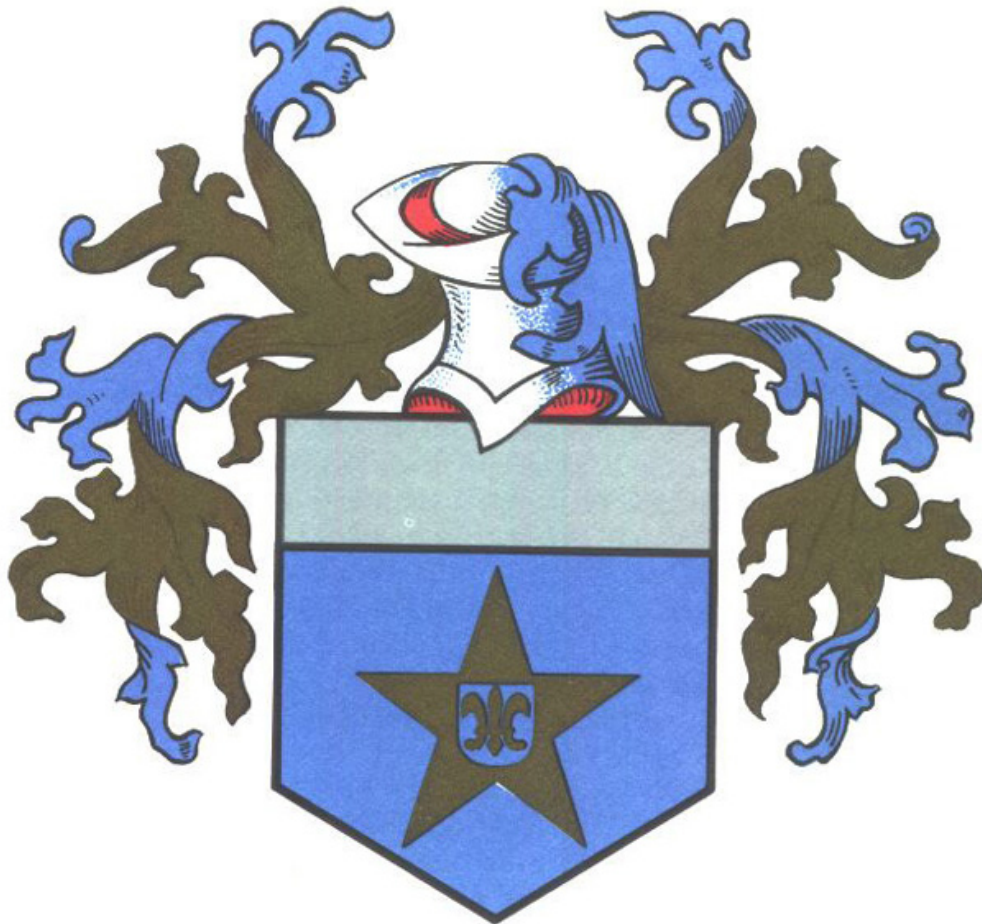

DESCRIPTION OF OUR COAT-OF-ARMS

The upper third of the shield is silver white, signifying light, brightness, joy. The rest of the shield is sky blue, the complement of white, signifying hope, courage, fidelity. The repetition of these qualities in the smaller shield imbedded in a star is very emphatic. The star evidently signifies the strong desire to live in light, night as well as day. The French lily, "Fleur de lis," within the star-imbedded shield, evidently shows the intimate connection of the Boyers d'Eguilles with the throne. The whole scheme is one of dignity and recognized loyalty.

CHAPTER 7 (AG)

GABRIEL BEYER

1—AG GABRIEL BEYER was born, probably about 1700, in Tartary, Asia, where his German parents had gone for some reason or other, according to tradition recorded by his great-granddaughter, Mrs. McCahon (4—AG221); he died in 1766 in Bristol Twp., Philadelphia Co., Pa. When he came to America has not been established. He is reported to have been naturalized at Philadelphia, Pa., in 1743. According to a deed in the hands of Squire Kauffman, Friedensburg, Berks Co., Pa., he owned a large farm in Oley Twp., Berks Co., Pa., as early as 1733. A deed found in the Reading Court House Deed Book 2A, pages 390-392, shows that in 1754 John Lesher gave Gabriel Beyer and Casper Griessemer a large farm of 132 perches in Oley Twp. in trust for the society of the Christian people inhabiting Oley. Another deed, found in Deed Book 3A, page 370, indicates the return of this property to the Calvinists Congregation in 1764. The *Pennsylvania Archives*, Fifth Series, Vol. 26, page 244, confirms that he was in Oley Twp., Berks Co., Pa., on Jan. 20, 1758. He was still there in 1762, as the list of Berks County Taxables shows, and on May 11, 1763, as recorded on page 324, Mortgage Book AA, Reading, Pa. Administration records at Reading, Pa., show that he had identified himself with the Reformed Church of Oley, Berks Co., Pa. Gabriel left Oley in 1764 and came to Frankford in Bristol Twp., Philadelphia Co., Pa., where his will was made May 8, 1766, and probated July 9, 1766. This will is recorded in Book N, page 544, at Philadelphia, where his name appears as Bier, Beyer, and Bayer. His first wife died, and he found a second wife, Catharine, in Berks County, Penna., as recorded by his great-grandson Henry Boyer (4—AG1A6). Her name is mentioned on page 322, Mortgage Book AA, Reading Court House. His wife (2) Catharine died Sept. 10, 1789, and is buried at the Hood Cemetery in Germantown, Philadelphia Co., Pa. Gabriel's will names his wife Catharine, and mentions "my three children": John, Peter, and Elizabeth. These children may have been to his first wife, but we are not sure. The Oley Church records, where they may have been recorded, were poorly kept and lost. His widow, Catharine, married (2) Abraham Gross, as known from Philadelphia Orphans Court records dated Sept. 8, 1769, which show the petition of Gabriel's minor son Peter.

2—AG1 JOHN BOYER was born about 1750 or earlier, in Oley, Pa., as reckoned from the birth of his oldest son, and died Nov. 12, 1814 in Bristol Twp., Philadelphia Co., Pa. His granddaughter, Mrs. Mary J. Kluhenspies (4—AG168), reported that he was built stout and straight, six feet three inches

tall, called the strongest in a thousand. She said that he was a soldier, probably in the Revolutionary War, and that he was a favorite with the officers, frequently dining with them. Perhaps he was the Sergeant mentioned on page 155, Vol. 5, Fifth Series, *Pennsylvania Archives*, 1777. He was a farmer near Frankford, Bristol Twp., County of Philadelphia, in which locality he found his wife. His will was made June 8, 1812, and was probated Dec. 27, 1814; recorded in Book 5, page 388, at Philadelphia, Pa. He married Mary Smith, who died Oct. 19, 1834 at Germantown, Philadelphia Co., Pa. Both are buried in the Frankford Presbyterian Churchyard, Philadelphia Co., Pa. Her will was made Jan. 15, 1833 and was probated Oct. 27, 1834; recorded in Book 11, page 304, at Philadelphia. An interesting fact of her will is that she bequeathed her mahogany dining table to her "nephew Lewis Boyer, son of my son Peter Boyer." Apparently, Lewis was really a grandson, but the revising historian wonders why he was called her nephew. See Peter Boyer (3—AG16) and Peter Boyer (2—AG2) for further data on this problem and the problem of Peter's wife's name. Children, all named in John Boyer's will, were: Elizabeth, Rebecca, Gabriel, Sarah, Mary, Peter, John, Jacob, David, and Henry.

3—AG11 ELIZABETH BOYER married William Bowman, of Germantown, Pa., and became a Dunkard, or German Baptist. Two sons, Jacob B., and John, were executors of their grandmother's will in 1834.

3—AG12 REBECCA BOYER had died sometime prior to June 8, 1812, the date her father made his will. She married John Mower, and her three children, named in her father's will, were: Mary, Rudolph, and John.

4—AG121 MARY MOWER married, prior to June 8, 1812, Thomas Norton, as known from her grandfather's will.

3—AG13 GABRIEL BOYER, b. Oct. 5, 1772, d. June 26, 1827, Germantown, Pa. Like his father, he was a powerful man. He came to work in Germantown on a farm owned by his mother's sister, Mrs. Margaret (Smith) Bloyd. His mother had a third sister, Catherine, the wife of Thomas Wilson, whose daughter Margaret he later married. Boyer Street and Bloyd Street in Germantown are named after them. The old house stood on Boyer Street. Farmer. His will was made Apr. 19, 1827, and was probated Aug. 23, 1827; recorded in Book 9, page 84, at Philadelphia. The will of his brother David Boyer (3—AG19) was made and probated on the same dates; recorded in Book 9, page 85. Gabriel married Margaret Wilson, b. Jan. 10, 1780, Abington, Pa., d. Feb. 22, 1879. Both are buried at Hood Cemetery, Germantown, Philadelphia Co., Pa. Children: James S., John W., Anna, Katharine, Margaret, Rebecca, and Jeannette.

4—AG131 JAMES SMITH BOYER, b. Jan. 24, 1804 in Bristol Twp., near Frankford, Philadelphia Co., Pa., d. Nov. 17, 1864. He married Mary Ann Nickum, b. Oct. 13, 1806, d. Mar. 30, 1866. Both are buried in Hood Cemetery, Germantown, Pa. Children: Alexander H., Franklin A., Margaret V., Oswald M., and James H.

5—AG1311 ALEXANDER HENRY BOYER, b. Apr. 9, 1829, Germantown, Pa., d. Feb. 25, 1876; buried in Hood Cemetery, Germantown, Pa.

Farmer. Married Hannah S. Albright, b. 1830, Germantown, Pa. Children: Mary A., and William N.

6—AG131111 MARY ANN BOYER, b. Dec. 25, 1852, d. Feb. 17, 1905; buried at Ivy Hill Cem., Philadelphia, Pa. Married Henry Magee. Children: Lawrence H., and Margaret V.

7—AG131111 LAWRENCE HOFF MAGEE, b. Sept. 3, 1876, d. Oct. 7, 1949. Lived at Germantown, Pa. Married, Aug. 17, 1901, Philadelphia, Pa., Gertrude May DeHaven, b. Aug. 17, 1877, Phoenixville, Pa., d. June 27, 1963. Both are buried at Ivy Hill Cemetery, Philadelphia, Pa.

7—AG131112 MARGARET V. MAGEE married Thomas Smith, Germantown, Pa.

6—AG131112 WILLIAM NAPOLEON BOYER, b. Apr. 7, 1855, Olney, Philadelphia Co., Pa., d. Jan. 22, 1923. Lived at Germantown, Pa. Occasional steward. Married, 1876, Johanna E. Morrissey, b. Oct. 20, 1858, Germantown, Pa., d. Oct. 8, 1925. Both buried at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, Philadelphia, Pa. Children: William J., Mary V., Joseph E., Leo A., and Helen V.

7—AG131121 WILLIAM JOSEPH BOYER, b. July 17, 1877, Germantown, Pa., d. Apr. 19, 1917; buried at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, Philadelphia, Pa. He served in the Spanish-American War. Plumber. Lived at Nicetown, Philadelphia Co., Pa. Married, Aug. 27, 1913, Emma Dunkerfield, b. Aug. 8, 1884, Philadelphia, Pa., now deceased. No children.

7—AG131122 MARY VERONICA BOYER, b. Apr. 8, 1880, Nicetown, Pa., d. Jan. 26, 1947; buried at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, Philadelphia, Pa. Married, June 12, 1907, William J. Ryan, b. 8—AG1311232 GERALD THOMAS BOYER, b. July 29, 1925, Philadelphia, Pa. He was an Ensign in the U.S. Navy during World War II (radio man). Schoolteacher. Married, June 28, 1952, Anne Jane McElwee, b. July 31, 1928, Philadelphia, Pa. They reside in Philadelphia, Pa. Children: Gerald T.; Eileen A.; Thomas Joseph, b. Oct. 9, 1956; Mary Ellen, b. Aug. 23, 1961; Anne Kathleen, b. He was a minor about age 16 when he chose his master John Schrieber to be his guardian, as shown in Philadelphia Orphans Court records dated June 13, 1768. He went from Philadelphia to Rahway, N.J., when a young man. The hostelry which he kept became a famous rendezvous for American officers in the Revolutionary War. Presently he also enlisted, as Mrs. McCahon (4—AG221) records, evidently with proper authority, and was promoted to the captaincy of a company, but returned by and by broken in health, conducting his hostelry until death. His will, made Dec. 11, 1795, and proved June 6, 1797, indicates that he lived at Bridgewater, Somerset Co., New Jersey. He returned to his father's home, but went back to the store, and grew more contented. He became a member of the Old Arch and Third Street Presbyterian Church, and made up his mind to study for the ministry. He entered Jefferson College, Canonsburg, Pa., in 1804, and worked himself through by teaching during his vacations. He married (1) Oct. 20, 1806, Sarah Ann Dunlap, b. Aug. 20, 1786,

Unionville, Pa., d. Sept. 1, 1825. She was the daughter of Rev. Dr. James Dunlap, then president of Jefferson College. After his course was completed he started with his wife and a little daughter born Sept. 17, 1807, for Somerville, N.J. On their way they stopped over at the home of his cousin Peter Boyer (3—AG16), Frankford, Phila., Pa. At Somerville, N.J., or near Bound Brook, he taught school and pursued his theological studies. His first "call" was to Easton, Pa., where, because there was no edifice, he preached in the Court House. He became the Principal of an Academy there, in connection with his ministry. Presently he received two calls, one from Lancaster and another from Columbia, Pa. He accepted Columbia. Here he again combined teaching with preaching. Presently he was called to the Principalship of the York County Academy. He accepted this offer, but continued to preach for his Columbia congregation quite a while. These people loved him and called him "father Boyer." He moved to York in 1833. A tablet to his memory is placed in the church he served so long. His biographers accord to him the very highest praise as a man, as a teacher, and as a minister. The Association of American Boyers placed his picture on the button of the 1909 reunion. 4—AG228 ALEXANDER TURNER BOYER, b. Feb. 15, 1830, d. Oct. 15, 1833; buried at First Presbyterian Churchyard, York, Pa.

4—AG229 CALVIN BOYER, b. Mar., 1833. Lawyer in Leavenworth, Kansas. It was reported that Calvin "went to Denver" in the early days of that city, was connected with the Mint, married and had a son, perhaps other children. Miss Zennie W. Tomlinson (6—AG22111) reported the family lost sight of him

3—AG23 JACOB BOYER, no data, except that he was named in his father's will made in 1795.

3—AG24 MARY BOYER married Captain Benjamin Taylor, New Brunswick, N.J. Captain Taylor was a sea captain, and was lost at sea. Mary may be buried at the Old Dutch Reformed Church, Bound Brook, N.J. There was only one living daughter in the 1860's.

4—AG241 (DAUGHTER) TAYLOR married I. V. Talmage, Bound Brook, N.J.

2—AG3 ELIZABETH BOYER, no data, except that she was named in her father's will made in 1766.
